### The "Mitty"

The "Friends of Triumph", a loosely knit group of enthusiasts who either race, autocross or are otherwise heavily involved in the competition aspect of Triumphs, gathered at Road Atlanta this month for the Walter Mitty Classic. Each year the Mitty focuses on particular marques and this year they chose Triumphs and MGs. Along with all the other vintage race classes, there were separate practice sessions for TRs and MGs as well as a separate all MG/TR race on Sunday.

I had planned to race my TR4A but unfortunately broke the engine at another race (VIR) two weeks earlier and was not able to get it back together in time for the Mitty. Not to be deterred from participating in some form, I signed up to crew for another TR racer and so was able to spend the weekend at RA surrounded by friends and Triumph race cars. One of the high points was that Kas Kastner, the original Triumph racing guru and author of numerous Factory racing manuals, was there the whole weekend giving tips, signing autographs and generally being helpful and friendly.

Although I would have preferred to be racing, there's a lot to be said for watching vintage races, especially when they feature the cars we're most fond of.

Pay particular attention to "Peyote", a very famous Triumph special that was hand built out of aluminum in the early 1960s using a TR3 frame and drive train. It shows up in several shots on the lower part of the page. It's obvious that no attention was given to its appearance, but it is extremely light and very fast. Rumor is that the name Peyote comes from the substance the designer/builder was using at the time.
