My original assessment on the sloppy steering with almost two inches of play in the steering rack was due to bad rack bushings. This would have been correct on any other classic I have been familiar with but not here. When the rack was removed the rubber bushings look almost new with no wear. I tightened the minute play in the rack itself by removing a shim from the damper and reinstalled with new urethane bushings. I now only had one inch of play so I resorted to the unthinkable......The manual! It turns out that I needed tools # S-341 to spread the two rack mount brackets apart while tightening them in place. The local Triumph dealer was closed (since 1980 I think) so I decided to make my own S-341 with a threaded rod and some scrap metal. It worked! No play!

The manufacturer must have known that I enjoy frame problems. I also found a broken left rear differential stud and poorly repaired right front differential mounting. From What I can tell from my research on the internet, this is the norm for these beauties. The genius that designed this part of the frame should be sent to the "Russian Front." I marched in the same parade as many TR6 owners and welded reinforcement gussets to supplement the lame original mounts. While we are speaking about frame issues, I also found a crack on the left rear spring perch and the music of my welder continued.

The dreaded rear axle hub removal was the only thing regretfully I had to farm out after a failed attempt at removal. After building a very strong puller and applying what seemed like 700 ft-lbs of force with a long pipe, an audible snap!! The end of the axle shaft and my ego shattered. I was happy to find another individual on the internet that proclaimed victory doing these also broke a few. With some good advice from Angelo Guzman I bit the bullet and bought a rebuilt unit. Man, it's painful to pay for something that I think I should be able to do!

Although my wife Lauralyn is very supportive, I'm sure this leaves her wondering why I would spend good money for a little car and have it suspended on blocks for what seems like eternity (no Jeff Foxworthy jokes here please). I'm certain my marriage will be back on solid ground once the few remaining back ordered parts arrive and I let her take the wheel.
